Please be informed that the Central Office through the PS-PRD office have issued the attached SCHOOL READINESS ASSESSMENT (SRA) TOOL, hence, all are advised to be guided of the following instructions:

- 1. This School Readiness Checklist can be used to determine which among the schools in a MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MGCQ) AREA may be nominated for the pilot implementation of the face-to-face learning delivery modality. This checklist aims to assess school readiness for the face-to-face learning modality in the time of the COVID-19 pandemic. Thus, it is required to observe honesty and transparency in answering this tool and the given information shall be verified and validated.
- 2. For a school to be eligible for the pilot implementation of the face-to-face learning delivery modality, it needs to meet all the indicators (YES for all indicators) prior to the opening of face-to-face classes (YES for all indicators). The Schools Division Office (SDO) shall facilitate the administration of this readiness checklist to the nominated schools and shall validate the submitted results. Then, the summary result shall be transmitted to the Policy, Planning, and Research Division (PPRD) of the Regional Office (RO) for consideration and approval. The RO shall submit the final list to the Office of the Director for Planning Service (PS).
