



### TOPICS FOR THE PLENARY SESSION

Topic 1: "Climate Disaster Ready: Capacity Building in Disaster Preparedness and Response"

Outline: This emphasizes the importance of strengthening communities' ability to manage and respond to climate-related disasters. It highlights the need for comprehensive training and education for local leaders and youth, ensuring they are equipped with the skills to prepare for and respond to disasters like floods, typhoons, and droughts. Capacity building includes improving infrastructure, creating effective evacuation plans, and conducting disaster drills. Integrating sustainable practices, such as coastal restoration and reforestation, is key to reducing disaster risks and enhancing resilience. Despite challenges like funding and coordination, empowering communities through training, leadership, and active participation is essential for building disaster-ready, climate-resilient communities.

### Topic 2: "Awareness to Action: Lak-ang as a Platform for Youth-Driven Climate Advocacy for Sustainability"

#### Outline:

This highlights the role of youth in marine conservation through the Lak-ang platform. Marine ecosystems face threats like pollution and overfishing, making their protection crucial for sustainability. Youth can raise awareness through campaigns and engage in actions like beach clean-ups and coral restoration. 

Picture 1. Diagram


