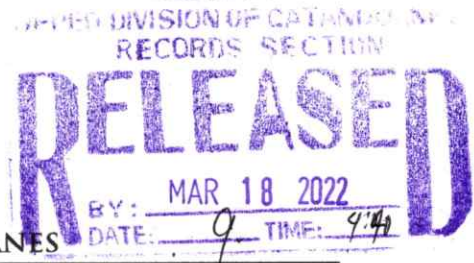

RESUMPTION OF THE SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH AND NUTRITION SERVICES

1. The Schools Division of Catanduanes, through the Schools Governance and Operations Division, would like to inform all health personnel that the delivery of Medical and Dental Services will resume immediately in schools implementing limited face to face classes.
2. The School Health and Nutrition personnel must prepare their schedule of school visitation with approved travel orders to their assigned district areas starting April 2022. School Clinic teachers are then requested to prepare their students' health cards.
3. All SDO SHN personnel except school-based must report in the SDO every Mondays and Fridays.

Subject: RESUMPTION OF THE DELIVERY OF SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH SERVICES IN SCHOOLS PARTICIPATING IN THE PILOT IMPLEMENTATION OF LIMITED FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES

Consistent with the **DepEd-DOH Joint Memorandum Circular 2021-01** titled *Operational Guidelines on the Implementation of Limited Face-To-Face Learning Modality* (Item Nos. 7.4.5 and 7.4.6), the Office of the Undersecretary for Administration, through the Bureau of Learner Support Services-School Health Division (BLSS-SHD), directs all schools that are implementing face-to-face classes to **resume the delivery of school-based health services to learners.**

These include:

1. Health assessment
2. Nutritional assessment (height and weight taking)
3. Vision screening
4. Deworming
5. Immunization
6. Other medical, dental and nursing services.

Health services shall preferably be delivered to the learners as they attend the face-to-face classes in schools.

Schools may also request learners, who are in the home-based learning modality, to report to the school solely for the purpose of availing these services.

Schools are also asked to resume the recording and reporting of learner's data generated through forms being filled up for Basic Education Information

System (BEIS) or for the School Dental Health Care Program (SDHCP).

Schools that have not joined the pilot implementation of limited face-to-face classes shall continue with the community-based delivery of health services. This is covered in **OUA Memorandum No. 00-1020-0198** titled *Advisory on the Implementation of the Medical-Nursing Services and the Adolescent Reproductive Health Program for SY 2020-2021*.

Officials in these schools are encouraged to allow the use of their premises for the Community-Based Immunization, especially if DepEd learners are among the beneficiaries. They will be guided by **OUA Memorandum No. 00-1021-0118** titled *Recommendations on the Requests of LGUs to Use DepEd Schools for Community-Based Immunization* which was approved by the Secretary.

The consent of the learners' parents shall be secured in services where they are required (e.g., deworming, immunization).

All involved shall strictly observe the required health standards in the delivery of the services.

The National Composite Team in charge of the pilot implementation of limited face-to-face classes is requested to reflect these activities in any future revision of the circular on face-to-face classes.
