

REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON THE ALIGNMENT OF LEARNING COMPETENCIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF INTEGRATED CURRICULUM DESIGN

To : Schools Division Superintendents

- 1. The COVID-19 pandemic that necessitated learning continuity via distance learning for two years brought tremendous impact to the academic performance of learners, most especially those in the early grades. Evidence of the learning loss in literacy and numeracy among Grades 1 to 3 because of the implementation of distance learning paved the way to the development of the 8-Week Learning Recovery Curriculum in Region V, the initial conduct of which is being practiced this School Year 2022-2023. This program is lodged under R5 Learning Recovery Plan, which is projected to be implemented in the next three years, 2023 to 2025.
- 2. As the Region exerts efforts to expand its implementation of the Learning Recovery Plan, there also arises the need for the development of an integrated curriculum in the early grades. This stems from the commitment of the DepEd Regional Office to provide continuous learning opportunities to Grades 1 to 3 learners that will ensure that the competencies in the different learning areas are cohesively integrated and will focus on their acquisition of skills and processes that are based on the identified needs of the early grade learners. Integrated curriculum is projected to be implemented in Grades 1 to 3 classrooms this coming School Year 2023-2024.
- 3. For this reason, this Office, through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division and in partnership with ABC+: Advancing Basic Education in the Philippines, will conduct the first in a series of workshops the REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON THE ALIGNMENT OF LEARNING COMPETENCIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF INTEGRATED CURRICULUM DESIGN on June 19-23, 2023 in a venue to be announced later.
- 4. In the five-day live-in regional workshop, participants will accomplish the following:
 - a. conceptualize an Integrated Curriculum Design for literacy and numeracy;

- develop a Learning Competencies Integration Matrix for Literacy and Numeracy;
- c. develop a vertical and horizontal alignment map of learning competencies for integrated learning in literacy and numeracy, and
- d. develop a blueprint for an integrated lesson for a specific grade level and quarter.

- 7. In selecting the teacher-participant, the following must be considered:
 - a. minimum of 5 years teaching experience in the early grades;
 - b. has full grasp of the competencies in Grades 1 to 3;
 - c. has excellent written and oral communication skills;
 - d. able to work with minimal supervision; self-driven and committed to accomplish tasks;
 - e. owns a laptop and can produce outputs using the technology, and
 - f. willing to be involved in the three session-workshops along integrated curriculum and learning resource materials' development.

- On the other hand, the school-head representative of the division who will be selected should have an experience in early grade teaching and can work well with a team of teacher-writers and supervisors. Those involved in this activity will be the same teacher-writers and school heads who will be engaged in two other workshops that are scheduled this July and August 2023.
- Submit the profile (complete name, position, school, grade level) of the teacher-participants and school-head representative in the division to this Office, via email joan.lagata@deped.gov.ph on or before June 14, 2023.
- All participants are expected to arrive at the venue in the morning of June 19, 2023. The first meal to be served is breakfast on that day, while the last meal is dinner on June 23, 2023. Opening Program is set at 9:30 in the morning on June 19.
- Everyone is expected to be present for the entire duration of the activity and should also bring their laptop, extension cord, USB/hard drive and pocket 23Wifi. Teacher-participants should also bring lesson maps, curriculum guides and Most Essential Learning Competencies (MELCS) in the different learning areas, together with references frequently used in Grades 1 to 3 that will be utilized during the workshop.
- 12. Arrangements should be made in the school so that teaching and learning will not be disrupted in view of the teachers' participation in this workshop, by ensuring that their classes are handled by other teachers, or the learners work on modules while closely supervised by teachers.
- Further, all participants are reminded to observe basic health protocols to ensure the safety and well-being of everyone. Face masks should always be worn, and hand sanitizers or alcohol should be kept on hand. Physical distancing measures shall also be consistently observed.
- Travel and miscellaneous expenses of the participants who will participate in the said activity shall be charged against local funds; while expenses for the board, lodging and workshop materials shall be charged against 2022 FLO Funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
