

PARTICIPATION TO ONLINE CAREER AND COLLEGE FAIR

- 1. Attached is a letter with attachments from the GuidanceNGO, a non-government organization that conducts career seminars and webinars, inviting the Grades 11 and 12 students for an online career and college fair titled "Career Expedition, a Year of Online Career and College Fair" which will be done every Friday afternoon from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm (4 hours) until May, 2022 through a virtual platform. This is FREE OF CHARGE.
- 2. Among others, important details include:
  - a. The activity is composed of two parts:
    - i. Career Clinic (1:00 pm to 3:00 pm) your students may choose to attend any of the 60+ career clinics
    - ii. College Fair (3:20 pm to 5:00 pm) virtual exhibit to colleges and universities
  - b. Only 40 SHS schools will be accommodated every Friday.
  - c. The guidance official/s will choose which Friday within the academic year they would like the SHS students to attend;
  - d. Should the school be interested to participate, **Attendance Agreement Forms** should be filled-up and sent to **guidancengo agmail.com** copy furnished the Division Career Guidance Focal Person. Transactions shall be made **directly by the school to the GuidanceNGO**.
- 3. Considering the benefits that the Senior High School students will gain from these activities along Career Guidance, schools are **encouraged** to participate, however, on a **voluntary** basis only. Every school can send up to **100 students**. Certificates will be given to students upon completion of the activities.



- 4. Moreover, participating students are advised to install Google meet, MS Teams and Zoom as the possible platforms prior to the webinar to avoid delays/inconveniences.
- 5. Travel and other incidental expenses relative to this activity are chargeable to local funds/school MOOE subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

### Greetings from GuidanceNGO!

Soon after, our state, local, and private universities will be issuing their respective admissions requirements.

Our senior high school learners must finally decide on what careers they will pursue as they will indicate these career choices on their applications to these universities.

On this note, GuidanceNGO, a non-government organization that conducts career seminars and webinars for more than 20 years, invites the Grade 11 and Grade 12 students within your Division to take part in an online career and college fair titled Career Expedition, a Year of Online Career and College Fair.

The Grade 11 and 12 students within your Division will be oriented by deans, program chairs, and professors who teach the college programs/careers your students would like to pursue.

The online event is happening every Friday from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm (4 hours) until May 2022. Guidance Officials within your Division will just choose which Friday within the academic year they would like their Grade 11 and 12 students to attend. The table below shows the careers to be discussed and the time period.

### Career Expedition 2021-2022 Schedule

1:00 to 3:00 pm – CAREER CLINIC, a focused consultation about college programs and careers. Four (4) 30-minute career clinic sessions featuring various college programs that will cover the following topics:

- key areas of study about each college program;
- what skills and characteristics students need to develop to study certain college programs;
- college program curriculum;
- college training that students will undergo; and
- · employment opportunities after finishing each college program.

## RATIONALE, OBJECTIVES, AND EXPECTED OUTPUT FROM THE EVENT

### **CAREER EXPEDITION 2021-2022**

### a Year of Online Career and College Fair

### Rationale

In a matter of months, some of our senior high school learners will venture into a new level of education—higher education. Prior to being admitted, they have to meet the admission requirements of our colleges and universities. On the application forms to these institutions, they have to indicate the college programs or "courses" that they intend to major in.

Our learners will be evaluated by our universities based on these career choices and they require deeper insights about these careers.

As such, senior high school learners require substantial information about the college programs they will pursue before making those life-defining decisions.

#### **Objectives**

Attendance to the Career Expedition event aims to achieve the following objectives:

- Clarify matters pertinent to the college programs they think of pursuing. The event will unravel
  the key areas of study about 60+ college programs or careers as explained to them by 60+ experts
  (deans, program chairs, and professors) who have mastered what these college programs are
  really all about. Speakers in this event are doctors, lawyers, architects, engineers, educators,
  captains, etc.
- 2. Assist our learners in gaining exposure to a diversity of careers; not just the usual college programs they are already familiar with.
- 3. Lend assistance to the senior high school learners as they prepare for the rigors of college education. There will be substantial discussion of what college training our learners will undergo. Do our learners know the skill set or character they need to develop in pursuing certain careers? Will these college programs require students to attend conferences, will there be a thesis requirement, practicum, or on-the-job training?
- Resolve misconceptions about many careers as some students have developed ideas about careers that need to be rectified.
- 5. Identify the better and suitable colleges and universities for the study of many college programs. The event will showcase higher education institutions that excel in various college programs.
- 6. Be oriented on what our senior high school learners need to prepare as they apply for entry into our colleges and universities. What are the procedures involved? Will they go through a bridging program in case their senior high school track or strand is not aligned to the college program they want to pursue? What scholarships do these colleges and universities offer?
- 7. Gain a wider perspective of employment opportunities after finishing the college program.
