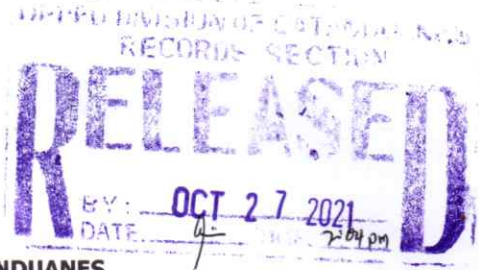

1. In connection with Regional Office V Advisory, dated October 14, 2021, re: "Corrigendum/ Addendum to the OUA MEMO 00-91-0216, Reminder and Updates on the Implementation of the Regional Climate Change Caravan 2021, this office will be conducting a **Division-Level Poster Making Contest for Secondary Students** with the theme "**Learner's Resilience Amidst Climate Change: The Bicolano Experience**".
2. This activity intends to highlight initiatives and best practices of Region V in building the knowledge and capacity of learners and personnel on Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation (CCAM) and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) and in elevating the level of learners' participation in climate action.
3. All secondary schools are encouraged to participate in this activity. 1st Place winner will represent the **Division** for the **Regional Poster Making Contest for Secondary Schools**.

(Annex A – Division Memorandum No. ____ s, 2021: Conduct of Division-Level Poster Making Contest

1. The mechanics as reflected in the Regional Concept Note are as follows:
 - a. The contest shall be open to Grade 7 to Grade 12 Learners;
 - b. The poster must illustrate the theme “Learner’s Resilience Amidst Climate Change: The Bicolano Experience”;
 - c. The poster shall be done in a ½ size Illustration Board, portrait orientation;
 - d. The poster must be done in free hand using any available medium;
 - e. Use of Black pentel pens as outline is PROHIBITED;
 - f. A one paragraph explanation of the drawing shall be indicated at the back of the poster. This also includes the name of the student, name of coach and name of school;
 - g. The contestant must be given two (2) hours to finish with his/her work;
 - h. An uncut and unedited video shall be taken focusing on the contestant while doing the poster from start to finish, with the finished product focused at the end of the video. A wall clock or digital clock must be visible in the video to verify the time. Non-compliance may mean Disqualification.
 - i. The poster will be judged according to the following criteria:
 - ✓ Relevance to the theme – 30%
 - ✓ Originality – 30%
 - ✓ Creativity and Presentation – 30%
 - ✓ Overall Impact – 10%

2. All posters and attachments must be submitted at the SGOD Office – DRRM Unit **not later than November 2, 2021 at 11 O’clock in the morning**. The Selection and announcement of the winners will be conducted on November 2, 2021 at 1 O’clock in the afternoon.

3. The prizes for the contest are as follows:

a.	1 st Place	-	3,000 Php
b.	2 nd Place	-	2,000 Php
c.	3 rd Place	-	1,000 Php
d.	4 th Place	-	500 Php
e.	5 th Place	-	500 Php

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Title: Learners Resilience amidst Climate Change: The Bicolano Experience

Rationale

Bicol Region is one of the most disaster-prone areas and high-risk environment due to its geophysical location. Natural hazards such as storms, floods, drought and volcanic eruption put the lives of its people at risk. These hazards also impede the provision of education and threaten educational investments. In recognition of these threats, Region V continuously implements information dissemination campaigns on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management to schools, communities and private sectors. These interventions are anchored to Sustainable Development Goal #13 that envisions a strengthened resilience and adaptive capacity to climate-related hazards and natural disasters in the country. Thus, igniting the importance of these programs in increasing the knowledge and capacity of the community to adapt and mitigate the impacts and risks of such hazards while reducing the region's vulnerabilities. Further, in recognition that human well-being is dependent on the environment and sustainability concerns to which actions need to be taken, important indicators in the development and improvement of educational aspects shall be implemented to ensure learning continuity for Bicolano learners even in the midst of disasters and emergencies.

Objectives

Region V Regional Climate Change Caravan aims to:

- Highlight initiatives and best practices of DepEd Region V in building the knowledge and capacity of learners and personnel on Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation (CCAM) and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM), and in elevating the level of learners' participation in climate action;
- Provide an avenue for learners to express their creativity through visual arts, and feature these artworks that showcased their knowledge and skills to educate, inspire and encourage their fellow learners to participate in climate action; and
- Instill awareness among learners and personnel on ways to strengthen their resilience amidst climate change and disasters.

Mechanics for the Poster Making Contest:

1. Prior to the scheduled Regional Climate Change Caravan, each division is expected to conduct a division-level poster making contest;
2. This shall be open to Grade 7 to Grade 12 learners;
3. The poster must illustrate, interpret and emphasize the theme;
4. The artwork shall follow a portrait orientation on a ¼ size illustration board.
5. The name of the contestant, grade level, division, school name, and coach shall be indicated at the back of the poster.
6. The poster must be done in free hand using any available medium.
7. The contestant shall be given two (2) hours to finish their artwork.
8. The coach shall not interfere once the contestant starts with his/her work.
9. An uncut and unedited video shall be taken focusing on the contestant while working from start to finish, with the finished product focused at the end of the video. A wall clock or digital clock shall be visible in the video to verify the time limit and course of the contest. Non-compliance may mean disqualification.
10. The posters will be judged according to the following criteria:
 - a. Relevance to the theme - 30%
 - b. Originality - 30%
 - c. Creativity and presentation - 30%
 - d. Overall Impact – 10%
11. Official entries must be submitted to the respective Division DRRM Coordinator on or before 27 October 2021.
12. Division-level awarding ceremonies shall be held on or before 29 October 2021.
13. First place of each division will complete the thirteen (13) finalists, from which the Region Office shall choose one (1) grand winner and two (2) runners up (1st and 2nd). Official entries of each of the finalists must be submitted on or before 2 November 2021 with a letter of endorsement addressed to Dr. Gilbert T. Sadsad, Regional Director, at ord.rov@deped.gov.ph and essd.rov@deped.gov.ph
14. All 13 poster finalists will be featured in Region V's Climate Change Caravan on 4 November 2021.
