CONDUCT OF THE 1ST ALTALAMIDH CAMP: A TALENT DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY FOR THE REGIONAL FESTIVAL OF TALENTS

- 1. The Madrasah Education Program, specifically the Musabaqah plays a significant role in the National Festival of Talents (NFOT) and Regional Festival of Talents (RFOT) as underscored in DepEd Order No. 19, s. 2024. ALIVE is integrated into the NFOT, ensuring that the festival's activities and competitions align with the learning competencies and standards outlined in the program. In the activity, learners can demonstrate their proficiency in Arabic through Naseehah (oration), Harf Touch, and Qur'an Reading.
- 2. The competitions provide a platform for promoting and preserving Islamic culture and heritage through the participation of ALIVE learners. It fosters interfaith understanding and appreciation by showcasing the talents and contributions of Muslim learners within the broader educational community. Further, the aforementioned competition provides a platform for showcasing the talents and achievements of Muslim learners, promoting cultural understanding, and strengthening the teaching and learning process within the broader educational context.
- 2. Given this, the Altalamidh Camp, a talent development activity for the Regional Festival of Talent (RFOT), is scheduled on **December 2**, **2024**, at a venue to be announced later. The Division-Level Camp shall prepare students for the upcoming Regional Festival. MEP implementers are advised to hold school-level contests on **November 9**, and **16**, **23**, and **30 2024**, respectively, as part of the selection process for the camp.
- 4. The participants in the competition are the school winners of Virac Pilot Elementary School, Virac Central Elementary School, San Jose Elementary School and Bagamanoc Central Elementary School in the Harf Touch, Oration, Qur'an Reading, Spelling, and Islamic Values Quiz. To streamline the competition's administration, the NFOT mechanics and guidelines will be applied to Harf touch, Oration, and Qur'an Reading. For Spelling and Quiz, the SDO has developed a contextualized guidelines.
- 5. Participants, coaches, chaperons, and members of the technical working group are advised to wear Muslim attire to add color to the activity. The following enclosures are attached in this memorandum:



ARABIC LANGUAGE SPELLING CONTEST

Altalamidh Camp, December 2, 2024

Rules & General Guidelines:

Basic Requirements:

1. Two (2) contestants per school who are in Level I-VI of the ALIVE class shall be allowed to participate in the Arabic Language Spelling Contest. To ensure their enrolment, a certificate of enrolment duly signed by the school principal shall be submitted to the chairman before the competition.

Contest Guidelines:

1. Each coach shall submit 2 words for the easy, average, and difficult rounds which are encoded or written legibly in a ¼ sized long bond paper to be given to the chairman before the start of every round. The reference books and the CG shall be the bases of the coverage of the spelling. The words to be spelled should be used in the sentence correctly for example:

Easy Round
1. altalamidh
Pangungusap:
Ana maa altalami

Ang mga **altalamidh** ay nag-aaral sa madrasah.

2. Every correct answer shall be tabulated and timed as follows:

Round	Time Allotted	Points
Easy	30 seconds	1
Average	1 minute	2 points
Difficult	2 minutes	3 points

- 3. The chairman shall request one of the judges to read the words and the sentence thrice. Then, the chairman shall say, "Go" to signal that the contestants can start writing collaboratively the correct spelling of the word in a ¼ sized long bond paper to be provided by the TWG. After the allotted time, the chairman shall say, "stop", the contestants shall raise their papers and shall be collected by the judges.
- 4. The judges shall check the correct spelling and capitalization (if needed) of the words. Then, the scores shall be tallied in a tally sheet or board whichever is available.
- 5. The team with the highest score shall be declared as winner.

ISLAMIC VALUES QUIZ

Rules & General Guidelines:

Basic Requirements:

1. Two (2) contestants per school who are in Level I-III of the ALIVE class are allowed to participate in the Islamic Values Quiz To ensure their enrolment, a certificate of enrolment duly signed by the school principal shall be submitted to the chairman before the competition.

Contest Guidelines:

- 1. Each coach shall submit 2 questions for the easy, average, and difficult rounds which are encoded or written legibly in a ½ sized, crosswise long bond paper to be given to the chairman before the start of every round. The questions should be written in Filipino and should be in accordance with the MEP Curriculum Guide (CG) and reference books.
- 2. The easy and average questions shall be in a multiple-choice format. In the difficult round, the contestant shall write the answer in Arabic or in Filipino (if there is a corresponding word for it). Correct spelling, capitalization and punctuation should be observed.

- 6. The chairman shall request one of the judges to read the words and the sentence thrice. Then, the chairman shall say, "Go" to signal that the contestants can start writing the correct answer in a ¼ sized long bond paper to be provided by the TWG. After the allotted time, the chairman shall say, "stop". Then, the contestants shall raise their papers and shall be collected by the judges.
- 7. The judges shall check the answers of the teams. Then, the scores shall be tallied in a tally sheet or board whichever is available. The team with the highest score shall be declared as the winner.

GENERAL GUIDELINES 2024 NATIONAL MUSABAQAH



(A Showcase of Talents and Skills in Arabic Language and Islamic Values)

- The Musabaqah is open to all learners in the public schools who are enrolled and tagged in LIS as ALIVE learners.
- Learner-participants should have registered and complied with the following requirements prior to the activity:
 - a. Certification as Winner/Regional Memorandum;
 - b. Parents' Consent;
 - c. PSA-annotated Birth Certificate;
 - d. Accomplished Entry Form;
 - e. School Form 10 (for Verification);
 - f. Medical Certificate, and;
 - g. School ID
- Any learner-participant who fails to comply with the requirements and the qualifications specific to each category shall be disqualified.
- 4. Filled out entry form should be submitted at least two weeks before the conduct of the activity. (possible goggle form)
- The learner-participants shall be given a control number to conceal the region they represent.
- Winners in each category shall receive medals. All participants shall receive a certificate of participation.
- Winning coaches shall receive certificate of recognition while non-winning coaches will be given a certificate of participation.
- 8. The top 3 regions shall be awarded with a plaque of recognition.
- Only official coaches can file an appeal to the Grievance Committee, should there be contest.
- 10. The whole proceedings shall be recorded by the NTWG.
- 11. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- A. There shall be one (1) learner-participant, Grade 5, male or female, ages ten to eleven (10-11).
- B. The learner-participant shall be given five to seven (5-7) minutes including preparations.
- C. At the first bell, the learner-participant shall get ready. At the second bell, the learner-participant shall start the "Muqaddimah" (Introduction). At the third bell, the learner-participant may stop as he/she already consumed the minimum number of minutes or continue until the fourth bell for the maximum number of minutes. The learner-participant whose speech is shorter than the minimum requirement of five (5) minutes as well as those who exceeded the maximum of seven (7) minutes will get a deduction of one (1) point from his/her total score for every minute or a fraction thereof in excess/deficit of the allotted time.
- The learner-participant may choose English or Filipino as a medium of delivery.
- E. "Adillah" (evidences) from the Qur'an and Hadith should be recited in the Arabic Language.
- F. The printed copy of the entry shall be submitted to the NTWG Secretariat during the Solidarity Meeting, a day before the competition.
- G. The oration (naseehah) shall not, in whole or in part, expressly or impliedly, subvert the principles of democracy, offend any religion, sect, or creed, or violate either the standards of decency or the laws on libel and oral defamation.
- H. For hygienic and observance of health safety protocols, each participant will bring their own lapel microphone/clip-on microphone

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- There shall be one (1) learner-participant per region, Grade 2, male or female, ages seven to eight (7-8).
- B. During the contest proper, the learner-participants shall be seated at the designated holding area. They should not see the process undergone by the contestant on stage.
- C. The learner-participants take turns on stage to identify the letters engraved/cut on illustration board within one (1) minute. The facilitator mixes the 28 letters as they take their turns
- D. There shall be one (1) timekeeper/buzzer, one (1) recorder, one (1) tabulator and a panel of judges.
- Timekeeper shall signal the start and the end of time allotted for each learnerparticipant.
- F. Panel of judges shall confirm the number of the correctly identified Arabic letters.
- G. The recorder tallies the scores.
- H. The corresponding time of each participant shall be flashed on the screen.
- The three learner-participants with the highest number of correctly identified Arabic letters in a shortest recorded time shall be declared as the winner. There shall be first,





second and third winners. In case of tie, another three (3) letters shall be added to twentyeight (28) letters for the clincher round to be given by the board of judges to determine in
the place/rank from which they tied. One point shall be given for every correct response.
The whole proceedings shall be recorded by the NTWG.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- There shall be one (1) learner-participant per region, male or female, ages twelve to thirteen (12-13).
- During the contest proper, the learner-participants shall be seated at the designated holding area. They should not see the process undergone by the contestant on stage.
- C. The panel of judges shall choose the surah to be read by the learner-participants.
- D. The learner-participants shall read the selected surah in Tawasot.
- E. Each learner-participant shall bring a copy of the Holy Qur'an.
- F. Learner-participants should wear proper attire (black abayah and white kombong/hijab for female and kimon with totob/kopya for male).
- The learner-participant shall be seated on the floor with the book stand and use their own lapel/clip-on microphone in the actual reading of the selected surah.
- H. The learner-participant shall read the surah or ayah in tawasot within five (5) minutes.
- For hygienic and observance of health safety protocols, each participant will bring their own lapel microphone/clip-on microphone
