

NCFF GUIDELINE ON NATATANGING PAMILYANG PILIPINO (NPP) | 2022

National Committee on the Filipino Family (NCFF)

NATIONAL SEARCH FOR NATATANGING PAMILYANG PILIPINO GUIDELINES

1. BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

In the Philippines, the family is the driving force that pushes the Filipinos to work hard and to achieve growth and survival. It is in the family that a child learns basic values of right and wrong, respect for others, kindness, and compassion. These values feed the aspirations of every Filipino to work hard and be resilient.

The high regard that the Philippine government has for Filipino families is enshrined in the 1987 Philippine Constitution which recognizes the sanctity of family life and the need to protect and strengthen the family as a basic autonomous social institution.

In the Southeast Asian Region, one thing stands out in the way the families are perceived. Based on Article 16(3) of the Universal Declaration on Human Rights and Article 23(1) of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the family "is the natural and fundamental group unit of society and is entitled to protection by the society and the State."

The national search for exemplary families in the Philippines is consistent with the country's aspirations embodied under Ambisyon Natin 2040. This activity is an initiative of the National Committee on the Filipino Family (NCFF) in collaboration with other government agencies and non-government organizations.

The National Search for the Natatanging Pamilyang Pilipino highlights the resiliency, courage, and strength demonstrated by the Filipino Family in overcoming the challenges they face including the harrowing period of the pandemic. The Search also looks at how these families cope with challenges as they continue to adapt to the fast-changing environment and shift in the value system.

Furthermore, Ambisyon Natin 2040 mandates the development of the Filipino Family Sector Priorities of 2019-2022, outlining strategies and initiatives that are family-focused, results-based, human rights-based, gender-responsive, conflict-sensitive, disaster-resilient, participatory, and socially inclusive.

II. LEGAL BASES

Ambisyon Natin 2040 embodies the collective long-term vision and aspirations of the Filipino people for themselves and for the country in the next 25 years, as planned by the Philippine government through NEDA.

The 1987 Philippine Constitution recognizes the sanctity of family life and the need to protect and strengthen the family as the basic autonomous social institution and the foundation of Philippine society.

The Universal Declaration on Human Rights of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights describes the family as the natural and fundamental group unit of the society that is entitled to protection by the State.

Executive Order (EO) No. 241 issued on February 9, 1995, established the NCFF as the lead in the development of and advocacy for policies and programs in strengthening Filipino families. The said EO was issued pursuant to Proclamation No. 60 of 1992 declaring every last week of September as the National Family Week of the Filipino Family.

Executive Order No. 209, series of 1987 otherwise known as the Family Code of 1987 on protecting and promoting quality family life.

Republic Act No. 8369 of 1997 establishes Family Courts to provide exclusive jurisdiction over cases involving families and children.

Reproductive Health Act of 2020 on responsible parenthood provides, among others, Filipino women and men the right to health and instills in them health consciousness.

Republic Act No. 8972 of 2000 known as the Solo Parents Welfare Act ensures financial and special assistance to solo parents.

Republic Act No. 11310 of 2019 or the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program to institutionalize the Conditional Cash Transfer (CCT) Program aimed at breaking the intergenerational cycle of poverty – The Pantawid Program or 4Ps focuses on human capital investment in families with children 0-18 years old.

III. SCOPE AND COVERAGE

The search shall focus on exemplary Filipino families nationwide.

IV. OBJECTIVES OF THE NATIONAL SEARCH

Primarily, the search aims to celebrate and honor the Filipino Family and its contribution to nation-building, confirming its role as the foundation of Philippine society.

Secondarily, it also commits to achieve the following:

- To recognize and award exemplary Filipino families who demonstrated exemplary Filipino way of life and have significantly contributed to nationbuilding
- To develop a pool of ambassadors in promoting NCFF goals, promote Filipino values, and act as resource persons in Family Development Sessions, fora, and other family development-related initiatives

To showcase good practices and notable accomplishments of the family that contributed to the development of the Filipino family as the foundation of society

V. ELIGIBILITY OF NOMINEES

Families may be nominated provided that:

- The family members are Filipino citizens
- A family with good moral character and without criminal record
- Regardless of socio-economic status, income had not been derived from gambling, child labor, prostitution, extortion and other similar illegal sources

VI. SCREENING AND SELECTION

The criteria for the selection and validation awardees are anchored on Ambisyon Natin 2040 which aims for Filipino families to have matatag, maginhawa and panatag na buhay.

Matatag (Stable): Stability of the family

Indicators	Points
A. Healthy and harmonious relationship among family members and household	25
The family exhibits open communication between spouses and between parents and children. The family also portrays a positive relationship helping each other in resolving conflict and is built on quality time / work-life balance, teamwork, and appreciation of each other.	
B. Resiliency and ability to cope with crisis	25
The family exhibits emotional and mental resilience and is able to manage their concerns / issues, especially in challenging times. The family is also able to practice mental wellness and proactive response to challenges.	
C. Voluntary and active involvement in the community	25
The family is able to actively engage in community activities and take advantage of opportunities to contribute to various causes. The family is able to practice shared responsibilities and meaningful ways to support, earn, and work collaboratively with a group of peoples to	42

Indicators	Points
D. Spirituality as demonstrated through acts of kindness and compassion	25
The family has a peaceful and caring environment wherein members demonstrate moral integrity, respect, and empathy. The family is able to build meaningful positive connections. The children understand and demonstrate acts of kindness and compassion.

Maginhawa (Comfortable): Quality of life and adequate standard of living

Indicators	Points
A. Provision of Basic Needs	20
The family has a stable income or is financially secure to provide for the daily basic needs of the family and support a peaceful / comfortable lifestyle.	
B. Responsible parenthood	20
Parents are able to guide and support their children, and take the initiative to attend ERPAT, MAPA, and other relevant sessions to strengthen the practice of responsible parenting. The parents also promote and practice positive discipline and are able to nurture the potential of their children.	
C. Quality Education	20
The family is able to send the children to school and provide opportunities for family members to develop appropriate skills and competencies and be productive and contribute to society.	
D. Family life with direction and purpose	20
The family exhibits informed decision making and has a slear direction towards the accomplishment of their desired poals along with the provision of basic needs, education, ecreation, etc., helping realize the full potentials of family members. The parents may also practice child spacing.	
. Balanced lifestyle, Healthy, and Clean living	20

Indicators **Points** The family has a positive outlook focusing on good healthy habits, promotion of wellness, and balanced-lifestyle. Total 100

Panatag (Peaceful): Health, Peace, and Order in the Family

Indicators	Points
A. Established house rules and clear boundaries Family exhibits clear individual boundaries. Each member clearly understands the rules, what is okay and what is not okay. The members also understand their respective specific roles and responsibilities to keep their family balanced and safe.	25
B. Practice human rights and child rights at home Respects the rights of children, respects women, have no incidents of gender-based violence or child abuse and exploitation at home, and stands up for the abused sector in the community.	25
C. Shared family decision-making Have interactive processes and engagements among family members in decision-making. Each member is able to communicate well with each other and understands each other's expectations and views about their respective involvement.	25

VII. PROCESS OF NOMINATION

The DSWD, through the NCFF, shall launch the Search and disseminate information on the guidelines and the Call for Nomination through letters, social media, and other possible means.

- 2. DSWD Field Offices will conduct the first phase of the search and establish their respective committees for the selection of the regional Awardee. LGUs, DSWD accredited CSOs, Organizations, and entities engaged in families may endorse a nominee (one nominee per organization) together with the following complete documents:
 - Accomplished Nomination Form that contains
 - ✓ Profile of the family, activities, awards received, community participation, records of accomplishments
 - A Write Up of no more than 1,000 words with Family Photos
 - √ Conforme to be signed by authorized / designated. representative of the Family nominated to the NPP
 - Three recommendations from the Barangay / credible source (local officials, parish church, any authorized / credible organizations)
 - Photos of the family and their activities (family reunions, school, and other extracurricular activities)
 - Optional: Video with link

The phases for the selection process are as follows:

- 1st Phase: Local Government Units (provinces and cities) and DSWD accredited CSOs endorse their nominees to the closest DSWD Field Office. The regional selection committee will facilitate the selection and endorse one regional awardee to the National NPP Selection Committee.
- o 2nd Phase: The National NPP Selection Committee will deliberate regional awardees and select the top 5 finalists.
- o 3rd Phase: The Awards Committee composed of selected panelists will deliberate finalists for the selection of the national champion Natatanging Pamilyang Pilipino.
- 3. It is understood that incomplete documents will not be accommodated and no additional nominations shall be entertained beyond the specified deadlines.
- Previous nominoos, except for regional awardees and national champions, may be re-nominated provided that all required documents are submitted and updated accordingly.

- NPP Awards Committee will be responsible for the administration, monitoring, coordination, and overall supervision of the NPP search activity. The committees at different levels will be constituted to screen and recommend eligible candidates who will be nominated for the NPP Awards.

- Formulate facilitate the adoption and monitor the implementation of the procedures and guidelines on the selection process as well as the recognition of awardees
- Formulate and approve relevant resolutions on the conduct of the Search for Natatanging Pamilyang Pilipino (NPP)
- Address the issues relative to the selection and awarding of the NPP
- Monitor and evaluate the implementation of the National Search for NPP annually to make necessary improvements
- Document testimonials and good practices which will serve as a reference for the advocacy and promotional materials on Filipino Families and NCFF
- Consolidate and facilitate the deliberation of regional finalists

- Facilitate call for nomination in their respective regions and consolidate nominees
- Ensure timely submission of the nominees with complete documentary requirements.
- Facilitate the selection, screening, and deliberation of the nominees received in their respective regions.
- Endorse the regional awardee to the National NPP Awards Committee
- NPP Selection Committee. The NCFF shall identify and invite five (5)
 panelists who shall be selected based on their credentials and with the
 following considerations:
 - Exemplify good moral character
 - Have good standing in the community, no criminal record or involved in any scandalous activities / or issues
 - Have strong advocacy on Family or engaged in related programs / projects on family

Functions of the NPP Selection Committee

- Review profiles and documents of finalists from the regions
- Will deliberate and interview top 5 finalists for the selection of the National Champion who will receive the Natatanging Pamilyang Pilipino Award of the Year.

IX. AWARDS AND INCENTIVES

The national awarding shall be conferred annually every month of September during the National Filipino Week Celebration.

National Champion - Natatanging Pamilyang Pilipino award of the year Finalists/Awardees: One Awardee / Finalist in every 17 Regions

The awardees shall receive Certificates/Plaques of Recognition, cash incentives of at least Php 50,000.00 for the National Champion and Php10,000.00 for the regional awardees. The awardees shall also be featured on relevant social media platforms and materials, providing the opportunity for the promotion of exemplary Filipino Families, the work of NCFF, and sharing of experiences,

X. ROLES OF THE WINNERS

- Will be ambassadors promoting NCFF goals and other family developmentrelated initiatives/activities.
- Resource Persons in Family Development Sessions, Fora, and other related activities by the NCFF
- Help in the advocacy efforts of the NCFF

XI. FUNDING AND RESOURCES

The necessary amount to be incurred in connection with the implementation of the National Search for NPP shall be primarily under the DSWD and secondary shared by the government agencies concerned, charged against their respective regular budgets subject to availability of funds. These funds for the operations of the activities and programs shall be included in their respective General Appropriation Act.

In the same manner, NCFF Members may co-share resources needed for the activities or may engage in resource generation / mobilization activities as may be allowed by the laws to warrant the success of the national search.

XII. EFFECTIVITY

This Guideline shall take effect immediately upon its approval and shall be in force until amended or rendered inapplicable.

ANNEX A - Definition of Terms

For purposes of this guideline, the following terms are basically defined based on the NEDA Ambisyon Natin 2040 and the NCFF Committee concepts and perspectives:

Active participation and advocacy - refer to involvement in community activities and promotion for the protection of the environment to include water, air, parks, forests, animals and wildlife

Family - refers to the natural and fundamental unit of society entitled to protection by the State. It is the basic social support system with the important role in preserving the sanctity of marriage and providing care and protection of children, older persons, persons with disability, and other vulnerable groups, especially in times of disaster that include the COVID 19 pandemic.

Filipino citizen - a natural-born or naturalized Filipino citizen with allegiance to the Philippine government, and who respects Philippine culture and traditions, laws, rules, and standards of living

Family cohesiveness and well-being - refers to the stability, care for the health of members, and strong connectivity through constant communication and performance of duties as members of the family to address challenges. These are the results of meaningful activities of the family during reunions, anniversaries, rests, and recreations.

Family Values - refer to positive aspects or characteristics of the Filipino family in the tradition of dangal (honor), paggalang (respect among family members and self-respect), pakikisama/ pakikipagkapwa (expressed mutual and reciprocal obligations), pag-aaruga/ pagkalinga (caring), utang na loob (debt of gratitude), palabra de honor (word of honor), katatagan (resiliency), pagmamaha! sa Diyos at sa Bayan (love of God and Country), malayang pananalita (freedom of speech), paggalang sa karapatang pantac (respect for human rights), pagmanialasakit (compassion), and paggalang sa kalikasan (respect for the environment)

Maginhawang pamilya - refers to a family with a comfortable life, able to achieve improved nutrition and health, opportunities for entrepreneurship, sustainable livelihood and decent jobs, affordable and disaster-resilient housing, and access to education and expanded prospects on improved learning and participation

Matatag na Pamilya - refers to a strongly-rooted family with respect and shared values. Strengthened relations among its members are brought about by a human rights-based, gender-responsive, conflict-sensitive, disaster-resilient, and socially inclusive environment complemented by mutual support within the family

Nation-building - refers to a wholistic effort to being a productive, useful, participating and peace-loving member of the community

Panatag na Pamilya - addresses the kind of environment the NCFF envisions for the family. It outlines a peacoful and secured community/ environment and resiliency from disasters and emergencies. With an improved living conditions, the Filipino family is provided opportunities to engage with partners in the locality, able to advocate rights and contribute to development. It also addresses various forms of vulnerabilities due to life cycle risks, economic, environmental and natural, and social governance risks.

Quality education -- a formal or informal schooling/ training and development toward productivity and improvement of the standard of living as a contribution to nation-building

Recognition of family accomplishments – refers to the acknowledgment of the nominee's significant efforts to achieve family goals with humility and readiness for more challenges as validated by testimonials and awards given by individuals, groups or organizations

Resiliency – the ability to be strong and spirited in coping with challenges, difficulties or crisis situations

Volunteerism – refers to active angagement and charitable/ deliberate involvement in the community in addressing urgent concerns and issues to expedite appropriate action/ resolution without expectation of remuneration
